

ANA Ticket Rules and Restrictions:

- Travel must be from one of the 8 gateway cities that ANA operates from in the United States (Chicago, Houston, Los Angeles, New York, San Francisco, San Jose, Seattle, Washington DC) to Tokyo. Individuals are responsible for transportation to and from the selected ANA gateway city in the United States they choose to depart to Tokyo). If travelers need assistance with connecting flights in the US, ANA can assist or travelers can separately book flights on their own US domestic flights.
- Round trip travel must be to and from the same ANA United States gateway city and to Tokyo, Narita airport.
- Seat confirmation depends on availability and no upgrade is permitted. Please be advised that it might be difficult to confirm seats for travel during peak seasons and on weekends.
- The following blackout dates apply to the economy class gratis tickets and the economy class low season discounted fares:
 - December 17, 2016 ~January 03, 2017
- Travel is not applicable on ANA Code share flights (NH5000-7999).
- Successful bidder for the two ANA round trip tickets from the US to Tokyo, Japan will be responsible for any applicable tax and fees including fuel surcharge in addition to the cost of the ticket. Payment of applicable taxes and fees will be in the form of credit card only.
- Current total taxes and fees for round trip are approximately \$100 per passenger. This fluctuates daily due to exchange rates.
- Tickets are non-transferable and non-reroutable. (The issued ticket may only be used by the passenger whose name is on the ticket.)
- Tickets do not have a cash value and are automatically void if they are sold, bartered or altered.
- Winners will need to submit names for travelers to the ANA Washington DC office for reservations and also need to be one of the travelers.
- Two passengers need to travel together on the same itinerary.
- Travel must be completed by March 31, 2017
